**ROLL CALL**

Commissioner Chair Beermann opened the meeting. Administrative Assistant Llorián commenced with the roll call. Commissioner Lund arrived at 7:04 pm. There was a quorum with Alderman Sansone absent.

**APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

Commissioner Sullivan made a motion to approve the minutes of the March 5, 2018 meeting. Commissioner Ashcraft seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

## **ALDERMANIC REPORT**

Chief Krumm stated that with Alderman Sansone not present, there was no aldermanic report for the meeting.

## **BUDGET**

Chief Krumm stated he was hoping to have final numbers of the 2017 budget. He stated they do not show that West County EMS services have been paid. Chief Krumm stated that he projects the department to be 4.18% under budget. He concluded that the 2018 budget is still on course.

## **NEW BUSINESS**

### **2017 Year End Presentation**

Captain Quinn went over the police section of the report with the commission. He stated that many stores in the mall are not calling for an officer until after an incident has occurred out of fear of protesters gathering in front of their stores. He stated that many stores prefer not to prosecute.

When asked about the reduction in summonses, Chief Krumm stated that in January 2017 a new law prohibits a supervisor from ordering or even suggesting that officer's issue more summonses. This was part of the changes to police operations, regarding ticket quotas, from Senate Bill 5.

Captain Hall presented the fire section of the report to the commission. He stated that call volume went up when the department started taking calls from Kirkwood. He stated there were an increase in sick and cardiac calls as well as an increase in patient transports. Captain Hall stated that there was an increase in physical fitness training and fire training in general due to the ease of tracking those PowerDMS. He added that the modernized program makes it easy to track training. He concluded with the 2017 highlights and 2018 projects.

### **CALEA Mock Assessment**

Lt. Willoughby stated the CALEA Mock Assessment is scheduled for Wednesday morning. He stated that five (5) assessor will be coming in for the assessment. He added that all the procedures with CALEA standards are in PowerDMS. Lt. Willoughby concluded that actual assessment is scheduled for after Thanksgiving 2018 with hopes to get awarded May 2019.

## **OLD BUSINESS**

### **Resident Camera Program**

Chief Krumm stated that the City has not processed with advertising the resident camera program. He stated that other cities are not getting a lot to people signing up for the program.

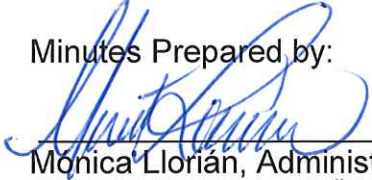
## **DISCUSSION**

**ADJOURNEMENT**

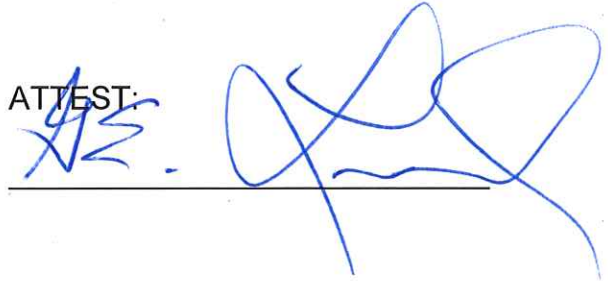
